Public Service Days starting tomorrow

DEARBORN

A new program to keep Dearborn neighborhoods cleaner begins on Monday — Public Service Days.

Public Service Days will happen twice a month for Dearborn residents: once on their trash pickup day that falls during the first full week of each month, and again on their trash pickup day two weeks later in the same month.

Residents can check their 2008 city of Dearborn calendar for a complete schedule of Public Service Days for each neighborhood.

On Public Service Days, neighborhoods will get a concentrated dose of city services — everything from curb to curb ice scraping in the winter to street sweeping, tree trimming and catch basin cleaning.

All parked vehicles and trash containers must be kept off of the streets from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. during Public Service Days in your neighborhood. (Note that the hours are 7 a.m. to 4 p.m., not the hours listed in the city calendar.)

Parked vehicles not moved off of the street during a neighborhood's scheduled Public Service Days will be subject to ticketing and towing.

Also, note that existing city ordinance prohibits residents from putting trash containers in the street at any time, including your regular pickup day. All trash, yard waste and recycling must be placed on the easement. This is required on every trash pickup day, not just those that coincide with your neighborhood's Public Service Days.
